

STRINGING CONCENTRIC PENDANTS

MATERIALS:

- Glass Pendants (See Notes)*
- Sturdy Cord
- Two Beads (See Notes)**

Step 1: Begin by threading the smaller pendant onto the cord.

Step 2: Choose the bead you'd like between the pendants, and string both ends of the cord through it.

Step 3: Slide the larger pendant between the two ends of the cord next to the first bead.

Step 4: String both ends of the cord through the second bead. Tie off the necklace as desired.

ADDITIONAL NOTES AND EXAMPLES:

*On Pendants:

A large, open pendant and a smaller solid piece work best for this beading technique. The example shown above uses [LF135 Organic Hoops](#) for the larger pendant and [LF136 Organic Drops](#) for the smaller. [LF137 Small Organic Hoops](#) can also work in place of the LF136 (**Example 1**).

[LF138 Geometric Hoops](#) and [LF139 Small Geometric Hoops](#) can also work well with this technique (**Example 2**).

**On Beads:

The key to stringing pendants like this is to find beads small enough to not overwhelm the glass but with holes large enough for a good cord to go through. A piece of wire wrapped to hold the cord together or a spacer can also work in lieu of a bead (**Example 3**).
